7. What is the purpose and how does the legislatively directed spending item provide a public benefit that is an appropriate use of taxpayer money?

Funding for Glen Oaks Community College would support the launch of a new radiologic technologists' program in St. Joseph County in southwest Michigan. Healthcare providers in the region face challenges recruiting and retaining qualified imaging professionals due to retirements, increasing demand for the profession, and competition from metropolitan health systems. Over the past three years, Beacon Health System in Three Rivers has hired 214 radiologic technologists and intends to continue this hiring trend to meet the system's demand. This is not a temporary staffing limitation, but a long-term workforce need which Glen Oaks is prepared to address by providing meaningful career opportunities for local students. The funding request is focused on essential startup needs that will allow the program to operate successfully from the start. Resources would support the purchase of radiographic

equipment, classroom renovations, safety upgrades, and accreditation readiness. These are foundational investments that ensure students are trained in an environment that reflects modern clinical standards and employer expectations. By helping Glen Oaks Community College fund the launch of this program, the state would be investing in a practical solution that benefits students, healthcare providers, and the broader community for years to come.
