A modern facility will allow firefighters to respond more quickly and efficiently to emergencies, improving response times and service delivery. The

new station will also provide appropriate space for updated equipment, training, decontamination, and operational support, ensuring compliance with current safety standards. Additionally, improved working conditions will promote firefighter health, safety, and retention. Collectively, these improvements will strengthen community protection, enhance service reliability, and ensure better emergency outcomes for residents, businesses, and visitors.
